Q: Repeat what topics you cover? Topics should be related to academics? A (Jaya): Most common is conflict with supervisors. Also, if a student has a baby or attend a sick family member. Significant things in life that could affect progress. If a student fails an exam. You can find out what your next steps are. Thing such as academic misconduct or alleged plagiarism go through the academic misconduct policy at FGS.

A (Michelle): We have cards that highlight when to come talk with FGS. We cannot help with courses (determined at program level for which courses to take, for example) or grades. Decisions that are made at the program level are things we can help. We are international specialists but will see any student! We do not provide immigration advice but will work with an immigration specialist to provide solutions and advice.

# Trends in Graduate Education (Dr. Dru Marshall, Provost and Vice President Academic, University of Calgary) 17:46

- Purpose of the University and value proposition of the University, used to be the pursuit of truth
- Still part of value proposition of the University, but in conversations with community, people want to know what the value proposition of a research-

intensive University, and there is a discussion around this in Eyes High and new Academic and Research Plans

- Student Experience and Impact
  - If we say pursuit of truth is not what Universities are about except in rare circumstances
    - At undergrad level is about employability and being job ready
      - Companies want to hire people come with a way of thinking and come ready for employment
      - In talking with Dr. Lisa Young about this, there have been some things done (mygradskills, internship program), allow you to do things outside your degree program
      - Chapter in your thesis can be a business plan
      - Lends toward increased utility of your degree
  - As current grad students, what would you like to see in your grad program?
  - o What can we do to help you once you finish your degree here?
  - I want to make sure our graduate programs are cutting edge. If you are thinking you are not getting what you want, if there are other things that the University can provide, please let me know.

Q: I would love to see more vocal support for the pursuit of truth. It seems like the University is turning its back critical thinking, focusing so heavily on STEM (not to denigrate STEM).

A: I would be interested in that sense, I absolutely think that is not what we've done. Q: In this context, the shift of the value proposition, from a pursuit of truth to utilitarianism. Particularly when humanities offer so much in times when truth is denigrated.

A: Let me clarify, when I say that every conversation outside the University is about that. that is not be exaggerating. When you are in meeting after meeting after meeting, you have to pay attention to the language that people are using. Otherwise we run the risk of not being on the right side of things. You could completely avoid it, detach from the community and be the ivy tower on the hill. To be frank, to stay connected to the community that we live, lead and serve. There are different corners of the University. Language is really important. We talked about problem solving, sticky problems, grand challenges. We don't solve problems here, we unpack them. When we talk about entrepreneurial thinking, we want to talk about lateral thinking, deep thinking. We have descriptions of words that fit different parts of the academy. We are not going to throw out values. When we talk about what we do at Universities, don't talk about pursuit of truth, why we talk about impact, applicable to all disciplines. What we have been bad at is telling our story. When I meet with community people if they don't understand the value of having a research-intensive university in Calgary, we wouldn't exist. It is important for you to be able to discuss the story of your research, how can you create a narrative that ties people into your story, your research. Last week there was a small group meeting with opportunities board for rebuilding their city, we had two really cool proposals, one on a biotech hub (just announced with Shell building), we also created a

city building project through EVDS. That city building project drew everyone into the room. It was all about how the University could make a difference by generating life into the downtown community and what the downtown could look like.

Q: Tara Christie and I had meeting about idea for the University, and that was one of the reasons I joined the Hunter Hub. There is a small problem here. Great place for creating networks. What I cannot find here at the University is resources for the students to think creatively. Most grad students are experts in their own fields, aren't interdisciplinary. Do something to help the students to think creatively.

A: We have a number of initiatives, including the Ambassadors program, Grad College, Hunter Hub, Taylor Institute.

A (Pres): I think what you are asking about is a course about thinking creatively, that's something we can take to the TI or academic director of the Hunter Hub.

Q: Bringing those opportunities so we can identify what's going on outside of the academy but bringing in strictly industrial language is also not aligning with some disciplines, so something in the middle.

A: We can do that. I will make sure that language reflects this.

Q: Are you planning on having a more public town hall for all grad students.

A: We have not considered it, but we can arrange that.

Q: EVDS to faculty, considering that three of our programs are professional programs, it would be nice to see an internship programs for professional programs. It sounds that a lot of students in our faculty would want that and it would be valuable, almost all in faculty are going into professions after.

A: Great idea. Have you talked to the Dean?

Q: Complicated process, but if we had more support.

A: I'll take that back. This fits in with some of things we had an idea abut

Q: What do we want out the University and how do we think the University should help us, but let's flip this. How do we encourage the people out there to know that we have skills? I'm on twitter way too much. UCalgary account has 50k followers, and departments have less. Individual faculties are the highest that will interact with us and signal boost. Why can't the main UCalgary account use the faculty level accounts for a prelim stream and boost those. It would increase exposure for our students.

A: There's a team.

Q: I understand that you want to be concise and have to flow.

A: It would be great to profile a grad student weekly.

Q: Tag research areas for example. Reports can look up like artic for example.

A: These are the kinds of ideas that are really important.

Q: I've never taken a philosophy course; how does the philosophy part of the degree play a role in my degree. How can I transfer to public that we are not just learning how to do techniques, but we are also learning how to think, how to answer questions. I don't see anything here, but other Universities are doing.

A: Do you ever talk to your supervisor about a course like this. Supervisors want to get you out the door. I took a philosophy course even though I am an exercise physiologist. Depends on the school, department, supervisor.

Q: I've some discussion with Dr. Beattie, brought idea to her. She thought it was important and that we need to rethink new grad students might be trained in GSE, one way to consider incorporating into candidacy for example, but many approval levels.
